



How PACTOLS uses the BBT

-
- By creating a temporary BBT tree with additional lower levels
 - By distributing PACTOLS concepts in the BBT categories, field by field
 - By reorganising the contents systematically
 - By correcting structural inconsistencies and confusion of categories in the branches
 - By revising the entire vocabulary

Deconstruction, the example of Death

- 133 concepts

- Redefinition of concepts
- Updating and augmenting vocabulary (176)

Permanent checking by experts

Reconstruction : focus on readability



Concepts

- systemisation of definitions,
- addition of non descriptors, synonyms and related terms,
- creation of pertinent associative relationships

Hierarchical organisation

- redistribution of large categories (activities, material objects, conceptual objects,...)
- rearrangement of existing categories into 15 new entries,
- personalisation of headings,
- keeping track of equivalent categories with
 - BBT facets
 - CIDOC-CRM classes
